Many thanks to all who attended our January Chapter meeting at the delightful Mount Vernon Inn. We were joined by Mr. Mark Brennan, a former Virginia Society

SAR (VASSAR) President and Mid-Atlantic States Vice President General, who is now serving as the Chair of the Planning Committee for the 2020 SAR Congress, to be held in Richmond in mid-July. Mark, along with Past VASSAR President Pat Kelly and Thomas Jefferson Chapter President Jim O'Kelley, briefed our attendees on the plans for Congress – including tours of the Yorktown Battlefield and the new Museum of the American Revolution at Yorktown.

We were also treated to presentations by Children of the American Revolution (C.A.R.) National President Mackie Storage and Virginia State C.A.R. 1st Vice President Alexandra Salley regarding their respective 2019-2020 projects. The National Project is supporting restoration efforts at Ferry Farm, George Washington's boyhood home; the State project is supporting the restoration of the bell at St. John's Church in Richmond site of Patrick Henry's famous "Give Me Liberty or Give Me Death" speech. Special thanks to our generous Chapter members who contributed to both worthy projects on the spot! If you wish to add your support, it's not too late - please contact Chapter Treasurer Richard Rankin for directions on how to contribute to one or both of these projects.

February is shaping up as a huge month! We'll kick-off with the VASSAR Annual Meeting at the Omni Hotel in Richmond on February 7-8. In addition to the business meetings and workshops (including one to be conducted by our own Jamie Callender on the Patriot Record System), 1st Vice President Bill Schwetke of the Culpeper Minutemen Chapter will be sworn in as the 2020-2021 VASSAR President. 



George Washington Birthday Parade



Help Promote the Study of History

National History Day is a non-profit organization based in College Park, Maryland that operates an annual contest for students in grades 6-12 to promote the study and appreciation of history among students. The National Contest is the final stage of a series of contests at local and state/affiliate levels. Students begin their journey by presenting their projects in classrooms, schools, and districts around the world. Top entries are invited to the state/affiliate level contests. The top two entries in every category at the state/ affiliate level are then invited to the National Contest, which is being held this year from June 14-18 at the University of Maryland in College Park.

As Chapter members, we have two opportunities this year to support this worthwhile effort and to further the SAR's objective of educating our youth about the Constitution and those who developed the American ideals and traditions.

High-School Level

Colgan High School in Prince William County is looking for judges to assist in reviewing student projects on Tuesday, February 11th and Wednesday, February 12th from 7:30 am – 1:30 pm. No prior experience is required - all you need to do is listen and ask questions about each student presentation. This year's theme is "Breaking Barriers." District Level

The District 5 State Level judging will occur on Saturday, February 29th at Mount Vernon High School in Alexandria. You may sign-up using the registration system provided by National History Day; simply go to the Virginia History Day District 5 Portal at *www.va-vadc4.nhd.org* and begin with "Create an Account" on the right side of the screen. Or, you may print out the Judges form found elsewhere in this issue, fill it out, scan it, and return it to *virginiahistoryjudgedistrict5@gmail.com*. Again, you do not need to be a history expert, and complimentary meals are provided!

Members Only Section of GWSAR.ORG It's There For You!



In case you have never established a Members Only linkage, or you have forgotten your username & password, I am here to remind you of how you do it and what you'll find there when you visit this part of the George Washington Chapter's website.

Go to our chapter website and click on the Members Only Login link (far right side) at the top of the Home page on the Chapter's website and then use either your website account (username and password) or social media account to gain access. For those that either don't have an account or have forgotten their username and/or password, I can help you with that if you send me an email at:

WEBMASTER@GWSAR.ORG

I will need to verify you are who you say you are so include your full name, email and phone number you provided for your GW Chapter membership and your State and/or National SAR numbers, if you know them. With this information, I can verify your account and then provide you with your password so you can gain access.

There is also another sign on option if you have a social media account (Google / Twitter / LinkedIn / Instagram / Amazon / Microsoft / Yahoo). The website will use your social media account to verify who you are thus providing easy and seamless access. I use a Google Chrome browser and am thus always logged into my Google account, so I use the "Login With Google" button and I get right in without having to remember another username and password. Use whichever option you are most comfortable with.
