

President's Corner



Compatriots:

This will be my last column, and as I look back on the past twelve months it was certainly an interesting time to serve as Chapter President!

All in all, however, I think we have managed to adapt to the conditions and restrictions of the pandemic environment and move the Chapter forward. After a short break, we began to hold virtual and in-person Chapter meetings; provide recognition to deserving students and first responders; mark Patriot graves; and conduct our annual observances at Mount Vernon on both the Fourth of July and Veterans Day.

None of this would have been possible without the dedication and support of many Chapter members. I was able to recognize some of them at our November meeting, but for those who were not able to join us then, allow me to do so again in this forum.

First, I was delighted to present the SAR's Distinguished Service Certificate to four Chapter members for their constant support: Covert Beach for his services as Master-at-Arms, including providing the Chapter with flags and banners for meetings and events; Jack Coulter, for compiling the Chapter's scrapbook and leading our participation in Wreaths Across America; Don Reynolds, for his many contributions as Chapter Chaplain; and Dave Thomas, for his development and updating of the annual Salute to Veterans slide show, as well as his guidance and counsel.

Next, I presented Richard Rankin, our Treasurer, and Rand Pixa, our Secretary, with the Virginia Society Chapter Service Medal, in recognition of their contributions to the Chapter during the past year. Richard's duties are peaking with a "perfect storm" at year's end: dues the development of next year's budget; and the preparation of taxable contribution letters. Rand, as our "Zoom master", has almost single-handedly enabled the Chapter (and the Board of Managers) to carry on with our meetings and to stay connected as a Chapter.

It was also my pleasure to award the Virginia Society Medal to four Chapter stalwarts: Jamie Callender, for years of service in multiple areas including grave marking and webmaster, and now with the Patriot Record System; Tom Roth, for service as Secretary, Treasurer, and now Vice President (not to mention Chapter Historian); Rich Sherman, for his many years of service with our Youth Awards Program and now as Chapter Registrar; and Paul Walden, who - even after his many years as a Chapter Officer were behind him - continued to devote his time and talents to needed activities such as grave marking and the Americanism Report.

Following those, I presented two other very deserving Compatriots with the Bronze Roger Sherman Medal: John Blair, for his many years as Chair of the Public Safety Committee, and Pete Farley, for his continued excellence in assembling and producing our Chapter newsletter.

It was also my great honor to present Past President Ernie Coggins with the SAR Meritorious Service Medal. Ernie has held multiple Chapter offices; represented the Chapter at countless State and National events – and on Committees; and been an invaluable voice of experience to me throughout my tenure. He is most deserving of this recognition.

As a fitting conclusion to the year, I presented the Lydia Darragh Medal to my wife, Bonnie. This medal, named after a Patriot who crossed British lines to deliver critical information to General Washington, is intended to recognize the assistance of the ladies who work behind the scenes supporting SAR programs. 



1776 on the 26th--Victory at the Battle of Trenton.


1783 on the 23rd--Washington resigns his military commission at Annapolis.

Members Only Section of GWSAR.ORG It's There For You!



In case you have never established a Members Only linkage, or you have forgotten your username & password, I am here to remind you of how you do it and what you'll find there when you visit this part of the George Washington Chapter's website.

Go to our Chapter website and click on the Members Only Login link (far right side) at the top of the Home page on the Chapter's website and then use either your website account (username and password) or social media account to gain access. For those that either don't have an account or have forgotten their username and/or password, I can help you with that if you send me an email at:

WEBMASTER@GWSAR.ORG

I will need to verify who you say you are, so include your full name, email and phone number you provided for your GW Chapter membership and your State and/or National SAR numbers, if you know them. With this information, I can verify your account and then provide you with your password so you can gain access.

There is also another sign on option if you have a social media account (Google / Twitter / LinkedIn / Instagram / Amazon / Microsoft / Yahoo). The website will use your social media account to verify who you are thus providing easy and seamless access. I use a Google Chrome browser and am thus always logged into my Google account, so I use the "Login With Google" button and I get right in without having to remember another username and password. Use whichever option you are most comfortable with.

After gaining access to the Members Only site, you have access to the following information:

- Membership Directory the lastest and historical versions dating back to 2013
- References SAR Brochure / Application Form / Grave Markings Research Material
- Reports Americanism / Committee
- GWSAR Business Approved Budgets / Chapter Board Meeting Minutes
