President's Corner



Compatriots:

Thanks to all who attended our October Chapter meeting. We again welcomed Compatriots and guests (including Ben Franklin!) "live" at Belle Haven as

well as on-line via Zoom. I am particularly pleased that we inducted five new members – four in person and one virtually. Congratulations and welcome to our newest Chapter members Ron O'Kelley, Sam Gilbert, Glenn Spencer, Mike Hoffman and Mike Bell. Special thanks also to Chapter Registrar Rich Sherman for keeping those applications moving along even throughout the pandemic slowdown.

The October Chapter meeting was just the tip of the iceberg in a very busy month. On October 17th Chapter Secretary Rand Pixa journeyed to Yorktown to represent the Chapter and lay a wreath at the grave of Virginia Patriot Governor Thomas Nelson buried at Grace Episcopal Church - as part of the annual Yorktown Victory Day celebrations. The following Saturday saw Chapter members spread across northern Virginia at multiple SAR ceremonies. Past Chapter President Dwight Whitney, resplendent in his Color Guard uniform, represented the Chapter at the Yowell Meadow Memorial Park in Culpeper, Virginia (along with Past Chapter Presidents Mike Elston and Ernie Coggins and Chapter member William Elston) as Compatriots from throughout Virginia gathered to commemorate the Culpeper Minuteman Battalion and to participate in the dedication of the Charters of Freedom Monument: replicas of the Declaration of Independence, the seven Articles of the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights cast in bronze plates, mounted to a stone base, and arranged precisely as one would see them on display at the National Archives.

That same morning, the George Washington Chapter conducted a grave

marking ceremony at the Trinity United Methodist Church in Alexandria. Led by Past President and Grave Marking Chair Paul Walden, we recognized and marked the graves of three Revolutionary War Patriots – John Longden, John Sloan and Joseph Smith. We were delighted to be joined by representatives of two other SAR Chapters (George Mason and Colonel William Grayson) and two Chapters of the Daughters of the American Revolution (Kate Waller Barrett and George Mason).

At the end of the month we shifted gears to recognize outstanding Public Safety officers in both Alexandria and Prince William County. On Wednesday, October 28th, Public Safety Awards Chair John Blair led a Chapter delegation in presenting awards to deserving members of the Alexandria Sheriff's Office. The following day John led another Chapter delegation out to Prince William County to recognize first responders from the County's Department of Fire and Rescue Services. Thank you for your efforts, John!

If you read this and get the impression that we are a busy Chapter, dedicated to furthering the objectives and ideals of the SAR, you would be correct! If you read this and get the impression that we have enough Chapter representation at these events, you would be wrong! There is always room for more. At our October meeting we heard from Ben Franklin himself on why he joined the Patriot cause!

Noted Franklin re-enactor Barry Stevens highlighted the infamous leak of the Hutchinson letters and the subsequent verbal abuse that Franklin, then agent for Massachusetts in London, endured before the British Privy Council in London on January 29, 1774.

This experience led Franklin to conclude that reconciliation with Britain was not possible.

Mr. Stevens was given a token of our appreciation, the Houdon bust of our namesake George Washington, by George Washington Chapter Vice President Tom Roth.

Grave Marking at Trinity Methodist Cemetery

On October 24, the George Washington Chapter memorialized three patriots of the American Revolution, John Longden, John Sloan, and Joseph Smith, at a grave marking ceremony at Trinity United Methodist Church Cemetery in Alexandria. Pastor Grace Han delivered the invocation. Paul Walden, Grave Marking Chairman, served as Master of Ceremonies. Wreaths were presented by the following SAR and DAR chapters: George Washington VASSAR, Kate Waller Barrett VADAR, Col. William Grayson VASSAR, George Mason VASSAR, and George Mason VADAR. Culpeper Minutemen Charters of Freedom Dedication

This was the dedication of a monument to our founding documents -- the Declaration of Independence, the seven Articles of the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. Replicas of these documents are in bronze plates, each mounted to a stone base, and arranged precisely as one would see them on display at the National Archives. The creator, Mr. Vance Patterson of Burke County, North Carolina, told the story how he and his wife conceived the idea for their home county several years ago, then founded Foundation Forward to propagate this idea to communities across the nation as an honor to these documents and to further access and promote education for citizens and visitors. His presentation to the audience of those who came to see the

unveiling was both uplifting and educational.

Thanks to the efforts of the Culpeper Minutemen Chapter and the support of the VASSAR Foundation and others, we are so fortunate to have Culpeper be included among the several communities having this monument thus far. I was proud to be there and participate in its unveiling. Thank you for presenting me the opportunity to participate.

The VASSAR Color Guard, under the command of Ken Bonner, carried the SAR colors and gave a musket salute during the ceremony.



Poster of Patriots Presented to Alexandria Library

On November 4, Paul Walden, Past President George Washington Chapter VASSAR and current President, Society of the War of 1812 in Virginia, presented a poster describing the service of five patriots of the American Revolution and two of the War of 1812 to the Local History and Special Collections Room in the Kate Waller Barrett Branch of the Alexandria Public Library. This was the result of several discussions on placing a plaque memorializing these patriots on the library grounds; however we were unable to obtain permission to do so. As a consolation, we offered to place a poster in the library memorializing these patriots in time for Veterans Day. The Patriots of the American Revolution who were interred on the library grounds are John Butcher, William Hartshorne, John Saunders, Benjamin Shreve, and perhaps the most famous, Dr. Elisha Dick, one of the attending physicians at General Washington's death. The War of 1812 patriots interred at the site are John Morgan and Thomas Smith.

--November Speaker --Dr. Matthew Costello


Our November speaker will be Matthew Costello, Ph.D. Dr. Costello is Vice President of the David M. Rubenstein National Center for White House History, and Senior Historian for the White House Historical Association. He will be speaking to us about his book "The Property of the Nation: George Washington's Tomb, Mount Vernon, and the Memory of the First President." It was published by University Press of Kansas in fall 2019 and was a finalist for the Washington Library's 2020 George Washington Book Prize.

Dr. Costello will be joining us via Zoom.

Matthew joined the Association in November 2016 after completing his Ph.D. and M.A. in American history at Marquette University. He received his B.A. in history and political science from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He previously worked on the George Washington Bibliography Project for the George Washington Papers at the University of Virginia. He has received research fellowships from Marquette University, the Virginia Historical Society, the United States Capitol Historical Society, and the Fred W. Smith National Library at Mount Vernon. He has published articles in The Journal of History and Cultures, Essays in History, The Dome, and White House History. Matthew also teaches a course on White House history at American University.

Signed copies of his book may be available from the Mt. Vernon Book Store and from the White House Historical Society.

Members Only Section of GWSAR.ORG It's There For You!



In case you have never established a Members Only linkage, or you have forgotten your username & password, I am here to remind you of how you do it and what you'll find there when you visit this part of the George Washington Chapter's website.

Go to our Chapter website and click on the Members Only Login link (far right side) at the top of the Home page on the Chapter's website and then use either your website account (username and password) or social media account to gain access. For those that either don't have an account or have forgotten their username and/or password, I can help you with that if you send me an email at:

WEBMASTER@GWSAR.ORG

I will need to verify who you say you are, so include your full name, email and phone number you provided for your GW Chapter membership and your State and/or National SAR numbers, if you know them. With this information, I can verify your account and then provide you with your password so you can gain access.

There is also another sign on option if you have a social media account (Google / Twitter / LinkedIn / Instagram / Amazon / Microsoft / Yahoo). The website will use your social media account to verify who you are thus providing easy and seamless access. I use a Google Chrome browser and am thus always logged into my Google account, so I use the "Login With Google" button and I get right in without having to remember another username and password. Use whichever option you are most comfortable with.
