#### **President's Corner**



Compatriots:

With September's meeting we recorded another first for the George Washington Chapter – a "hybrid" in-person and virtual gathering. A number of compatriots,

new members, prospective members and guests gathered in our habitual venue at the Belle Haven Country Club (appropriately socially-distanced, of course!) and a roughly equal number of compatriots and guests signed on via Zoom to round out the total attendance. In addition to inducting new members Will Arritt and Jim Bartholomew (welcome, gentlemen!) we were treated to a fascinating presentation on the Patriot Research System (PRS) by Chapter member Jamie Callender. Jamie challenged each and every Chapter member to complete four data confirmation and entry tasks associated with our personal SAR membership, and Vice President Tom Roth and I announced that we would recognize all who successfully completed those tasks with a certificate, SAR memento, and mention in the Chapter newsletter. Jamie's charts are posted on the Chapter website, or you may contact him directly for more information on the PRS.

As I've mentioned previously, our intent is to continue with these hybrid Chapter meetings at least through the end of the calendar year. I encourage you to consider joining us in-person; the Belle Haven staff did a wonderful job of setting up the meeting room and serving our members in a safe and responsible fashion. And, if you are still more comfortable participating virtually, please join us as well. We have plenty of room!

Remember, as well, that the Chapter is about much more than our monthly meetings, and there are multiple opportunities (both live and virtual) coming up that are very deserving of your

consideration and attendance. It may be too late to register by the time this issue of the newsletter hits the streets, but our Chapter will be represented on October 7th at a virtual wreath laying commemorating the 240th anniversary of the Battle of Kings Mountain (a decisive Patriot victory in South Carolina). Two weeks later, on October 17th, the SAR will recognize Governor Thomas Nelson with a wreath laying at the Grace Episcopal Church in Yorktown – normally just one of many events held during the Yorktown Day celebrations (most of which have been cancelled for this year). Details for the Nelson observance are still being finalized, but there will likely be opportunities for both virtual and in-person participation.

The following Saturday, October 24th, is a busy day on the SAR calendar. At 11:00 am, the George Washington Chapter will recognize three Patriots with a combined grave marking ceremony at the Trinity United Methodist Church Cemetery in Alexandria. I encourage as many of you as possible to join us for our largest 2020 grave marking event. That same day, also at 11:00 am, the SAR will be dedicating a memorial to the Culpeper Minutemen and installing the Charters of Freedom at Yowell Meadow Memorial Park in Culpeper. This event is a VASSAR Presidential Initiative, so I encourage you to consider participating in that dedication as possible.

Finally, at 9:00 am on Wednesday, October 28th, we will be presenting Public Safety Awards to members of Alexandria Sheriff's Office in Alexandria. If you live nearby and can spare an hour or so, please join us in recognizing some of the area's incredible first responders.





#### William Ellery -- A True Patriot

William Ellery was born on December 22, 1727, in Newport Rhode Island. He grew up as the son of a merchant and entered Harvard University when he was only 16. He successfully graduated in 1747. When he returned to Newport, Ellery became a merchant like his father and got involved in the trading business. However, he quickly discovered that this profession was not in his best interest. After working as a customs collector and as a clerk for the Rhode Island General Assembly, he decided to enter politics. Little did he know, he was about to play a role in the future of a nation.

In the year 1776, one of Rhode Island's delegates to the Continental Congress (Samuel Ward) suffered an untimely death while the issue of Independence was being discussed. Since it was the smallest of the colonies, the Rhode Island legislature knew that at least two representatives were needed to make their population's voice heard. By this point William Ellery had already made his position on matter clear to his countrymen.

In the aftermath of the Battles of Lexington and Concord, Ellery became a major advocate for armed resistance against British occupation. He was quoted as saying, "You must exert yourself. To be ruled by Tories, when we may be ruled by Sons of Liberty, how debasing! There is liberty and fire enough, it only requires the application of the bellows. Blow, then, a blast will shake this country!" His patriotic words inspired thousands of Rhode Islanders to move into Massachusetts and join the growing Continental Army that was converging on Boston. Due to his ardent viewpoints and distinguished credentials, the Rhode Island chose Ellery to become their second delegate on May 4. Less than two weeks later, Ellery joined fellow delegate, Stephen Hopkins at the Second Continental Congress down in Philadelphia.

After the Patriot stand at Bunker Hill, the sons of liberty made the decision to sign the Declaration of Independence. Ellery later

wrote, "I was determined to see how they all looked as they signed what might be their death warrant. I placed myself beside the Secretary Charles Thomson and eyed closely as he affixed each name to the document. Undaunted resolution was displayed in



every countenance". When it was his turn to sign, Ellery made his signature big and clear. It was the second-largest signature after John Hancock.

After the signing, William Ellery was placed on Congress's Marine Committee and was instrumental in smuggling supplies and clothing to the Continental Army. However, he was prevented from returning to his home in Newport due to the city being captured and occupied by the British. Despite this setback, Ellery continued to serve in the Continental Congress until the end of the war.

After the US had become independent, William Ellery continued to serve in the Congress until 1786. After that, he became an advocate for abolishing slavery. In 1790, President George Washington appointed Ellery as Collector of Customs for the city of Newport, a post he held for the next thirty years. In the last years of his life, he reflected on his contributions to American independence and the life he had lived. He wrote, "I have been a clerk of the court, a quack lawyer, a member of Congress, one of the lords of the Admiralty, a judge, a loan officer, and finally a Collector of the Customs and thus, not without great difficulty, but as honestly, thank God, as most men, I have got through the journey of a varied and somewhat anxious life".

### Virginia Society–Semi-Annual Meeting September 18-19, 2020

The Virginia Society's Semi-Annual Meeting was held this year at Berry Hill Plantation in South Boston, Virginia the weekend of September 18-19, 2020. The Berry Hill Plantation and Conference Center is a restored 1840's era mansion and is considered one of the premier examples of a Greek revival mansion in the U.S.

The Semi-Annual meeting opened and closed with a parade of flags by the VASSAR Color Guard and a single gun artillery salute provided by VASSAR Chancellor Eric Monday. As previously announced, the compatriots present debated and approved a number of mostly technical changes to the VASSAR Constitution and By-Laws to simplify operations and bring them more into line with the NSSAR Constitution and By-Laws. The assembly also endorsed the proposed slate of nominees for NSSAR General Officer positions previously endorsed at the Atlantic Middle States Association Meeting in August. This includes our own Mike Elston, who is nominated to serve as Chancellor General for the 2021-2022 term. Elections for those offices will be held during the 2021 National Congress.

The VASSAR Nominating Committee also presented its nominations for officers for the year 2021. From the George Washington Chapter, Ernie Coggins was nominated to serve as Second Vice President, and Tom Roth to continue in office as Historian. Elections for those offices will be held at the 2021 VASSAR State Convention to be held the first weekend in February.

On Friday, John Blair presented a very well received workshop on Public Safety Awards and how he developed relationships and worked with local, police, fire, and Sheriff's departments to identify worthy recipients for these awards. Richard Sherman, Chairman of the VASSAR Knight Essay Contest Committee, discussed the

nature of the contest, scheduling, and how best to conduct it on the local level. He also reminded the assembly of the historical connection between VASSAR and this competition, which was originally established by a George Washington Chapter member. Ernie Coggins currently chairs the NSSAR Knight Essay Committee. Tom Roth used up many electrons performing photographic duties during the weekend.

George Washington Chapter Members, Ernie Coggins, Mike Elston, Will Elston, Tom Roth, John Blair, and Richard Sherman attended the VASSAR Semi-Annual Meeting, together with Linda Blair and Julie Elston. Dual George Mason-George Washington Chapter member and Chairman of the NSSAR Foundation, Joe Dooley was also very much in evidence.



He passed away on February 15, 1820, at the age of 92.

Out of all the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence, William Ellery is one of the least appreciated. However, I see him as an interesting figure who dedicated his life to helping those around him in the best way possible while securing the future of our country. He truly is a person who should be held in high regard.

### October Speaker -Ben Franklin

Our October meeting will feature a visit from Dr. Benjamin Franklin (aka Barry Stevens). Dr. Franklin will be discussing his experiences in London following his leak of certain letters from Massachusetts Governor Thomas Hutchinson and his verbal abuse by Solicitor General Alexander Wedderburn before the British Privy Council on January 29, 1774, and how this led him to realize that there could be no conciliation with Britain.

Barry Stevens has been presenting Benjamin Franklin since 2005. He was tending campfire while participating as a member of the First Virginia Regiment (a company of Revolutionary War reenactors). Visitors to the campfire would address him as "Ben" with such frequency and certainty that he outfitted himself as this special 18th Century gentleman and actually began answering their questions!

His education of Dr. Franklin has led him to read and study extensively on the life and times on this American personality.

That study is ongoing and without end. It has taken him to locations throughout the Colonies known to Dr. Franklin and even to Le Procope restaurant in Paris, France.

## Members Only Section of GWSAR.ORG It's There For You!



In case you have never established a Members Only linkage, or you have forgotten your username & password, I am here to remind you of how you do it and what you'll find there when you visit this part of the George Washington Chapter's website.

Go to our Chapter website and click on the Members Only Login link (far right side) at the top of the Home page on the Chapter's website and then use either your website account (username and password) or social media account to gain access. For those that either don't have an account or have forgotten their username and/or password, I can help you with that if you send me an email at:

I will need to verify who you say you are, so include your full name, email and phone number you provided for your GW Chapter membership and your State and/or National SAR numbers, if you know them. With this information, I can verify your account and then provide you with your password so you can gain access.

There is also another sign on option if you have a social media account (Google / Twitter / LinkedIn / Instagram / Amazon / Microsoft / Yahoo). The website will use your social media account to verify who you are thus providing easy and seamless access. I use a Google Chrome browser and am thus always logged into my Google account, so I use the "Login With Google" button and I get right in without having to remember another username and password. Use whichever option you are most comfortable with.

Noted Franklin re-enactor Barry Stevens will highlight the infamous leak of the Hutchinson letters and the subsequent verbal abuse that Franklin, then agent for Massachusetts in London, endured before the British Privy Council in London on January 29, 1774. This experience led Franklin to conclude that conciliation with Britain was not possible.
