President's Corner

Compatriots & Friends.

October is one of my favorite months with the weather cooling to just the right temperature, and



family and friends regathering after the Summer break.

Your Chapter has had a very busy and successful month. But, before I discuss our events and activities, I remind everyone that we have come again to the season of membership renewal. You all should have received an email or, perhaps, two from the Chapter with information on how to renew your membership for next year. Please take the time to respond, and, hopefully, add a little extra to help us fund Chapter programs.

We began the month of October with two big events--on October 9, our October Chapter Meeting at Belle Haven Country Club, and a significant patriot grave marking ceremony at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Graveyard in the Wilkes Street Complex.

Our Chapter meeting began with the report of the Nominating Committee Chairman Jay Henn. The Committee this year consisted of Jay Henn, Dave Thomas, and Richard Sherman. Their nominees for 2022 officers were: Richard Rankin - President, Rand Pixa - Vice President, William "Bill" Wilson -*Treasurer*, and Scott Walker – *Secretary*. The Committee also nominated Tom Roth for a three year term as an at-large member of the Board of Managers ending in 2024. Elections for 2022 officers will be held at our November 13 Chapter meeting. We also received a presentation by Virginia Children of the American Revolution President, Sara Cox, on her Presidential Project to raise funds for handmade bricks to be used as part of the reconstruction of President James Monroe's birthplace. This was followed by an excellent presentation

on the Battles of Lexington and Concord by our old friend Dr. Glenn F. Williams, a Senior Historian at the U.S. Army Center of Military History, Fort McNair. A number of NSSAR and VASSAR awards were presented to members of the Chapter who are identified more fully in other parts of this Newsletter.

The Chapter Meeting was shortly followed by a grave marking ceremony for patriots Lawrence Hooff and Peter Tatsapaugh who are interred at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Cemetery in Alexandria. Among other things, Patriot Hooff was a pallbearer at George Washington's funeral and served on the first vestry of St. Paul's. Peter Tatsapaugh, an in-law of the Hooff family, was a Sergeant in Captain Peter Mantz's Company, Maryland Militia, September 1775-October 1776. VASSAR President Jeff Thomas dedicated the markers and the VASSAR Color Guard added dignity to the event by posting colors and firing a musket salute. We were also honored to have a number of Hooff descendants present for the ceremony. The Reverend Jenni Ovenstone, Senior Associate Rector of St. Paul's, gave the benediction and a reading from Ecclesiasticus. VASSAR Chapters that presented wreaths included George Washington, Col. Fielding Lewis, Col. James Wood II, George Mason, and Fairfax Resolves. The Kate Waller Barrett Chapter, VADAR, presented a wreath, as did the Virginia CAR.

Members of the Chapter also participated in many other patriotic events during October. Ernie Coggins presented a wreath on behalf of the Chapter at the *Yorktown Day Commemoration* at Governor Thomas Nelson, Jr.'s Tomb. Ernie was joined by Chancellor General Mike Elston who presented greetings on behalf of the President General Davis Wright.



November GW Chapter Guest Speaker

Mark Edward Lender, Ph.D.

While the "Conway Cabal" is a fixture in the popular memory of the Revolutionary War, scholars of the Revolution have expressed doubts about any real threat it may have posed to Washington's command. Most academic historians have dismissed the Cabal as an annoyance by carping critics of Washington, but nothing more. Mark Lender takes a different view, and in his talk he will insist that the Cabal was real, and that the threat to Washington's position as commander-inchief was wider, deeper, and more serious than previous studies have allowed. Mark Lender will discuss the nature of the Cabal, who was involved—he will name names the motives driving their criticisms of the general, and the chief events that rocked the army and Congress as the Cabal unfolded.

Marker Dedication for Gov. Thomas Johnson

On October 23, Compatriot Paul Walden attended the dedication and unveiling of a marker commemorating the first Governor of Maryland, Thomas Johnson (1732-1819), at his grave at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Frederick, MD. The event was sponsored by the Maryland DAR and SAR, as well as the Sgt. Lawrence Everhart Chapter, MDSAR, and the Thomas Johnson Society, MDCAR. Thomas Johnson was a delegate from Maryland to the Continental Congress. He served in the Maryland Assembly when the Declaration of Independence was signed. During the war, he served as Brigadier General in the Maryland Militia, in addition to manufacturing ammunition at Catoctin Furnace in support of the Revolution. President Washington later appointed Johnson to the commission that designed the federal capital at Washington.

November through the years with George Washington

- **1752** on the 4th--Washington becomes a Freemason.
- 1752 on the 6th--Washington appointed Major in Virginia Militia.
- 1781 on the 5th--Death of Washington's stepson, John"Jacky" Parke Custis.
- **1783** on the 2nd--Washington bids farewell to army at end of Revolutionary War.
- **1789** on the 26th--First observance of the "day of public Thanksgiving" ordered by Washington at request of Congress.

October 23 – The Annual Commemoration of the Muster of the Culpeper Minutemen Battalion was held at Yowel Meadow Park in Culpeper, VA.

George Washington Chapter members attending were Tom Roth, Chapter President and VASSAR Historian, who participated by presenting a wreath, and Ernie Coggins, Past Chapter President and VASSAR Second Vice President.

Grave Marking-St. Paul's Cemetery, Alexandria

On October 9, 2021, the George Washington Chapter VASSAR conducted a grave marking ceremony for two patriots interred at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Cemetery in Alexandria: Lawrence Hooff, NSSAR Patriot 184360, born 1756, died 26 May 1834, who signed a Legislative Petition to Virginia House of Delegates, 27 May 1782, that included a request for a representative to the House of Delegates (formerly the House of Burgesses). Patriot Hooff was also a pallbearer at George Washington's funeral and served on the first vestry of St. Paul's. The second patriot honored was an in-law of the Hooff family: Peter Tatsapaugh, NSSAR Patriot 329280, born 1752, Lancaster, PA, died 5 October 1818 who was a Sergeant in Captain Peter Mantz's Company, Maryland Militia, September 1775-October 1776.

VASSAR President Jeff Thomas dedicated the markers and the VASSAR Color Guard added dignity to the event by posting colors and firing a musket salute. We were also honored to have a number of Hooff descendants present for the ceremony. 

Despite COVID and all of the limitations that still imposes on us, VASSAR and its Chapters are working through them to remain as active as ever, if not more so. There are numerous opportunities for participation, live and virtually in the coming weeks and months. Please review the list of upcoming events in this newsletter and on our new website for further information.

There are also numerous opportunities for personal involvement. This does not mean necessarily taking on a leadership position, but helping out with specific needs or projects. We are looking for members who might be interested in assisting in all of our Chapter activities, and encourage you to reach out to me or to our other officers if you have an interest or questions. Our contact information can be found in this newsletter.

Here are a few specific areas in which opportunities exist:

Website: Our Webmaster is looking for computer savvy Chapter members who would be interested in assisting him with the tasks of updating website content and general website management.

Public Safety Awards Committee: We are looking for members who are are willing/able to assist our Public Safety Awards Chairman in the logistics of this Committee, e.g., ordering medals and certificates.

Videography: In order to reach the largest possible audience, we are looking for members who can help us with recording and live broadcasting of our meetings and other events through Zoom, or other platforms.

Photography: We encourage all of our members to record their experiences and to share them with us so that we can memorialize the events in our scrapbooks, newsletters, and website. We also need members who are willing to serve as photographers for chapter events and to

serve as photo editors (helping to select and edit photos for chapter publications).

Public Speaking: We would like to hear from members who would be interested in making presentations in regarding the SAR and the revolutionary period to schools and to civic groups, either virtually or in person. Of particular interest would be presentations based on the VASSAR Patriots Chest and Flag Chest Programs. These are scripted presentations of objects provided in the Chests.

Public Relations: We are looking for a member who can be responsible for reaching out to local media outlets, keeping them abreast of our activities and encouraging attendance at our public events.

Color Guard and Colonial Attire:

Participation in SAR Events in Colonial Military Attire (or even civilian attire) is strongly encouraged by the SAR at all levels and enhances both our visibility in the community and your Chapter's credit (Americanism Award Points) within the Virginia and National Societies. I wish to particularly encourage members to consider participation at the chapter and state level in colonial uniform in the VASSAR Color Guard. One role of great importance (which we do not have at present) is having at least one member who is able/willing to carry the George Washington Chapter's own traveling flag as part of the VASSAR Color Guard at GW Chapter events.

Patriot Research System: One of the tenets of the SAR is to cherish, honor, and preserve the memory of those Patriots who served during the American Revolution in order that their descendants could be endowed with those inalienable rights that we now enjoy. The George Washington Chapter needs your assistance as we set out to validate the Patriot Research System (PRS) data for our Chapter Compatriots




