George Washington Chapter & NSSAR Special National Congress in Northern Virginia

One of the significant SAR events that occurred in our community in March was the Special National Congress of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. The Special National Congress was held on March 13 in the Westfield Marriot in Chantilly, Virginia. The limited purpose of the Congress was to make some amendments to the NSSAR Constitution to address some issues which came to light after the COVID-19 based cancellation of the 2020 National Congress. These amendments permit virtual voting and attendance at future Congresses if needed. The George Washington Chapter had a very prominent and active role in the Congress, in addition to the four members of our chapter who served as Delegates from the Virginia Society. The NSSAR Bylaws Committee and the Special Congress Organizing Committee were both chaired by Mike Elston, a past VASSAR and George Washington Chapter President. VASSAR 2nd VP and past George Washington Chapter President, Ernie Coggins, was Chairman of the Special

Congress Credentials Committee. GWC President Roth assisted as one of the Deputy Chairmen of the three-member Credentials Committee. Will Elston, a member of the George Washington Chapter, and Chaplain of the Virginia C.A.R., served as Deputy Chairman of the IT Committee, and kept the recording and live streaming of the Congress in operation. Former President General and George Washington Chapter Member, Joe Dooley, also served as Delegate from the Virginia Society to the Congress. The Special Congress was a very short event, but had very important results, and required much planning, especially in light of the COVID-19 related restrictions. Thanks to all participants.

Going forward, we are actively planning for our annual July 4 celebrations at Mt. Vernon and the President General's wreath presentation at Arlington National Cemetery, although the form those will take is to be determined. There is also a possibility that a pre-recorded form of the National Memorial Day Parade will be held, and I hope we will be able to provide more information shortly regarding possible SAR participation.

Despite COVID and all of the limitations that still imposes on us, all VASSAR and its Chapters are working through them to remain as active as ever, if not more so. There will be numerous opportunities for participation virtually and possibly live in the coming weeks and months. Please review the list of upcoming events in this newsletter and on our new website for further information.

There are also numerous opportunities for personal involvement. We are looking for members who might be interested in assisting in all of our Chapter activities, and encourage you to reach out to me or to our other officers if you have an interest or questions. Here are a few specific areas in which opportunities exist:

Public speaking: members who would be interested in making presentations regarding the SAR, and the revolutionary period in schools and to civic groups either virtually or in person and, in particular, presentations based on the VASSAR Patriots Chest and Flag Chest Programs. These are scripted presentations of objects provided in the Chests.

IT: As we move forward with more live activity, we will be looking for members who can help us with recording and live broadcast through Zoom, or other platforms, of these events for a wider audience. We are looking for people with computer experience who can help with website maintenance.

Photography: We encourage all of our members to record their experiences and to share them with us so that we can memorialize the events in our scrapbooks, newsletters, and website. We also need members who are willing to serve as photographers for chapter events and to serve as photo editors

Public Relations: We are looking for a member who can be responsible for reaching out to local media outlets, keeping them abreast of our activities and encouraging attendance at our public events.

Color Guard and Colonial Attire:

Participation in SAR Events in Colonial Military Attire (or even civilian attire) is strongly encouraged by the SAR at all levels and enhances both our visibility in the community and your Chapter's credit (Americanism Award Points) within the Virginia and National Societies. I wish to particularly encourage members to consider participation at the chapter and state level in colonial uniform in the VASSAR Color Guard.

March has been a remarkably busy month for the George Washington Chapter. We actively participated in numerous National, State, and Local SAR events. On March 20, we participated virtually in the excellent Commemoration of Patrick Henry's "Give *Me Liberty or Give Me Death Speech"*. This event was sponsored by the Richmond Chapter. I presented a wreath virtually on behalf of the chapter; Richard Rankin, Ernie Coggins, and Rand Pixa also attended. On March 16, the Birthday of President James Madison was celebrated. The public Montpelier commemoration was limited to a team from the United States Marine Corps, who presented a wreath on behalf of President Biden. However, our own John Blair arranged for a wreath to be delivered to Montpelier on behalf of the Chapter, and can be seen in the video of the event available on the Montpelier Facebook page. The Virginia Society also held a virtual commemoration on March 16 in honor of President Madison. I presented a wreath virtually on behalf of the Chapter. Paul Walden also participated by delivering greetings and presenting a wreath symbolically on behalf of the War of 1812 Society in Virginia. Richard Rankin, Jamie

Callender, and Rich Sherman also attended.

Saturday, March 13, turned out to be an "all-hands on deck" day for the George Washington Chapter. The March Chapter Meeting, Special NSSAR Congress, Virginia History Day, and the annual Commemoration of the Battle of Guilford *Courthouse* all occurred on the same day. Our Chapter was in turn represented by active participants at each event. Our very well attended March Chapter meeting (32 virtual attendees) featured a very well received talk on the Battle of Guilford Courthouse by Dr. John R. Maass based on his new book: *The Battle of Guilford* Courthouse: A Most Desperate Engagement (Military). Thanks need to go to Past Chapter President Dave Thomas, and compatriot Hank Foresman, who participated as judges in this year's virtual Virginia History Day Competition. The event this year involved several days of review of virtual submissions. Following his attendance at our Chapter meeting, former VASSAR and George Washington Chapter President, Larry Lisle, presented a wreath on our behalf at the Virtual Battle of Guilford Courthouse Commemoration. This major National SAR event was also attended by Richard Rankin.

Finally, the National Society held a Special National Congress on March 13 in the Westfield Marriot in Chantilly, Virginia, for the purpose of making amendments to the NSSAR Constitution. This Special Congress is addressed in more detail in another article in this Newsletter. I would like to express my thanks to all of the George Washington Chapter members who actively participated to make the Special Congress a successful event.

Our Chapter has modernized its website with new and improved features. You can start now to enjoy the public view of the updated website by going to https://gwsar.org


During the next couple of weeks, we will send you an e-mail inviting you to establish a password associated with your e-mail address. It's quick and easy to set up. Once you are set up, you will be able to log in to view members-only content including upcoming Chapter meetings, the Chapter roster with built-in messaging to other members, videos of past meetings, and archival records, as well as VASSAR and NSSAR material.

A key feature of this website is that members will be able to make online e-payments of annual dues renewals, event payments, and donations to the Chapter's checking account. That is significant because it eliminates writing checks, mailing checks to the right address, and adding postage.

The Wild Apricot system approved by our Board of Managers also supports meeting and event management, RSVPs, Chapter history archives, and other features. The Board of Managers has decided to gradually introduce this functionality over the coming months to provide additional service alternatives to members.

While the online system is intended to provide a level of convenience to the many who have requested online capabilities, we will maintain our traditional methods of Chapter business (e.g. accepting checks as payment of dues and other fees) by not compelling any member to use the new online capabilities if he chooses not to do so.



April GW Chapter Guest Speaker Gabriel Neville

In 1776, one-third of the 8th Virginia Regiment was detached to reinforce George Washington in the north. Departing Winchester, the regiment traveled to Alexandria, then turned north to Philadelphia. The 8th Virginia participated in key engagements that saved the Revolution at Trenton, Assunpink Creek and Princeton. When New England troops on short enlistments went home, the 8th Virginia stayed on and became the core of a new, professional Continental Army.

Gabe Neville has spent decades studying the 8th Virginia Regiment and will share his original research on Captain William Croghan's detachment for the first time ever!

Alexandria Deputy Receives State Level Award

The Sons of the American Revolution recently recognized Deputy Myrna Juarez for her efforts in aiding a critically injured motorist. On March 5, John Blair of the George Washington Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution presented Deputy Juarez with an award from the Virginia State Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. Deputy Juarez received the award for her response, while off duty, to a major crash on I-95.

On June 30, 2017, just before 6AM, Deputy Myrna Juarez was driving to work when she witnessed a motor vehicle crash on the I-95 Express Lanes near Woodbridge. She saw a car overturn and then saw a person on the road. She immediately pulled into the emergency lane and ran to the crash scene. No other first responders were present and she could see that the victim, a man who had been ejected from the car, had a head injury. Deputy Juarez called 911 and then directed the passenger to keep pressure on the victim's head until medics arrived. When the Virginia State Police arrived, the victim was unresponsive and not alert. Deputy Juarez obtained gloves

from the Virginia State Trooper and she also applied pressure to the victim's head injury. Once EMS arrived on the scene, medics took over treatment and airlifted the victim to INOVA Fairfax Hospital.

Even though she was off-duty, Deputy Juarez never hesitated to take action and did her best to help a critically injured crash victim. For her actions that day, she was awarded the *Sons of the American Revolution Life Saving Award*.




